APPLICATION INFORMATION AND INSTRUCTIONS

1. DJRC-JR/SR Camp will be held at the Diamond J Ranch, Oroville, WA on Tuesday August 16,17,18, 2011 for youth 7-19 years of age. You will receive instruction, accommodations, meals, entertainment, see attached schedule, please. No stalls available, trailer tie suggested and camper must feed, water, clean horse area each day. Students may bring one horse for their event only. All campers are required to participate in all scheduled activities.
2. Cost for each applicant is \$150.00. Fees are due with application by July 31, 2011 to ensure a spot.
3. All participants must show proof of insurance before being admitted to camp.
4. Check in for DJRC is Monday night after 5pm & Tuesday, August 16, 2011 at 7-9:30am. **NO EXCEPTIONS!** At check in you will receive guidelines, maps, and schedule. No one is allowed to leave the ranch once they have checked in (Emergencies excluded, by the discretion of Al or Joanie Parsons).
5. All events are limited. These spots fill fast on a first come, first serve basis. With quality instructors, you will want to get your application in as soon as possible. We are still confirming instructor's schedules; these cowboys are in demand and traveling themselves, feel free to contact us for information.
6. Any student/any event may do ground work only. Rough stock events are limited to ground work only, depending on the students' ability at the discretion of respective DJRC leaders and instructors.
7. Upon arrival, EVERYONE go to registration desk. **ONLY** participants, parents and volunteers that are signed up and checked in may attend DJRC, due to insurance issues.
8. **NO DOGS ALLOWED**, due to insurance issues.
9. Parents' meals will be \$10.00 per day or \$5.00 per meal. Parents may camp with your trailer/horses area. No amenities available. DJ Ranch has showers/potties available.
10. Sleeping area provided for campers **ONLY**. Girls bunk area and boys bunk area are separate. All campers are required to **camp on-site in bunk areas**.
11. Camp will end following the presentation of ALL awards on the last day of DJRC. Campers will not be released Awards Ceremony is completely over. Due to the increased number of campers, plan to stay a while and honor all of them!

1. We release liability for an injury or death of a participant in any domestic animal activities resulting from the inherent risks of participating in this domestic animal activity.

Inherent risks of domestic animal activities include, but shall not limited to:

1. The propensity of any domestic animal to behave in ways i.e., running, bucking, biting, kicking, shying, stumbling, rearing, falling or stepping on, that may result in an injury, harm or death to persons on or around them;
2. The unpredictability of any domestic animal's reaction to such things as sounds, sudden movement and unfamiliar objects, persons or other animals;
3. Certain hazards such as surface and subsurface conditions
4. Collisions with other domestic animals or objects; and
5. The potential of a participant to act in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury to the participant or others, such as failing to maintain control over the domestic animal or not acting within such participant's ability.

2. Acknowledgement of Risk: The undersigned acknowledge(s) that rodeo is a dangerous activity and that participation in rodeo events, rodeo training activities and other rodeo related activities exposes the Participant to a substantial and serious risk of property damage, personal injury and even death. 3.
